The piece is a setting of the Scottish poet Robert Louis Stevenson's 'From A Railway Carriage'. The single movement work describes a series of fleeting moments as witnessed from a railway carriage speeding through the countryside. The whimsical nature of Stevenson's poem conveys a sense of wonder, perhaps a child's first train journey, taking in views of rolling countryside, village life or stations whistling by. With the lilting rhythmic backdrop of the motion of the train, fast busy music alternates with slower reflective sections evoking scenes that are merely glimpsed then gone forever.

Performance Notes

GENERAL

There is considerable flexibility in the tempi; the metronome markings are merely suggestions.

Because of the rhythmic lilt within the piece, the words need to be clearly articulated, generally crisp and light.

Hairpins without specific dynamic markings are to suggest expression or shaping within the overall dynamic. Please make the most of these as I like the idea that the piece is “breathing” or pulsing.

The textural glissandi are intended to represent a train whistle. Again please enjoy these moments allowing them to come out of the texture as would a train whistle.

The whispering should be pure whispering with no pitch.

Piano pedalling is at the discretion of the pianist.

INTRODUCTION. Serene

This section provides a reference point for various allargando sections in the piece. These sections should be rich and full in tone.

LETTER A, B, C, D. Faster than Fairies...Child-like Wonder

These sections are very physical, bringing to mind the energy of childhood. The rhythms should “bounce” along with the glissandi being “pushed up” with gusto.

LETTER E, F, G. Dark and Windswept

These sections have a darker feel. Bars 96 – 100 serve as a sort of pedal, crescendoing like a gathering storm towards LETTER F which should be strong and loud. Bars 115 onwards are dense with canons and counterpoint, again intending to evoke the swirl of wind and rain. Here again the hairpin dynamics should be contrasty, contributing to the drama of the section.

LETTER H. Calm After The Storm

There should be a sense of sudden calm here as if sunlight breaking through cloud. This section evokes the opening and calms the mood for the next child-like section.

LETTER I, K, L. Child-like and Playful

This section is intended to be relaxed, free and easy. I have tried to capture the glimpsed scenes with the sudden allargando sections. At LETTER J the playful mood is interrupted by the image of the tramp standing and gazing. This brings back the opening reflective idea. From then onwards the texture should be as light and delicate as daisy chains. At letter L the pace gathers momentum towards Letter M which reprises the main theme, this time slightly slower.

LETTER O. The Mill and Flowing River

At this point the tempo slows and there is a summary of the opening ideas with repeating tunes. The train is disappearing from sight.
