Programme Note

"New Dreams for Old" is based on a poem on the same name written by American poet and dramatist Cale Young Rice (1872-1943). Despite the poem having been written when Rice was in his mid-forties, it eerily predicts his unhappy mental state later in life, after his wife dies. The poem depicts a fragile narrator, desperate for a new purpose, after discarding the old dreams they once had. The pleas become ever more desperate as the poem draws to a close, with the piano providing a dream-like backdrop against the singer's disjunct and dejected melodies; the juxtaposition of promising dreams against the current unhappy situation of the narrstor.






