What is Earth?

Text by the Composer and Bahá'u'lláh

<i>Alto solo (spoken)</i>	What is this earth, then?

<i>Choir</i>	<i>"The earth is but one country, and all mankind its citizens."</i> *

PERFORMING NOTES

What is Earth? may be sung by a choir of between 20 and 30 singers.

Note 1: Graphic Notation, from bar 1: Whilst making a 'Sh' sound, change the shape of the mouth cavity to alter the relative pitch of the sound, in accordance with the line height and shape. Follow dynamics and any other instructions.

Note 2: Box Notation, e.g. from bar 7 in tenors and basses: The phrase within the box is to be repeated until the conductor gives a signal to stop (arrow at bar 14). For larger choirs, the maximum number of singers for these phrases is indicated (e.g. bar 6 in the basses). The singers must not be in time with one another during the boxed repetitions, but should stick to one of the conducted beats so that each singer can be one, two or three eighth notes out of step with one another. In order for this to happen, each singer chooses a rest of between 0 and 2 eighth notes at random before repeating. After the signal to stop at bar 14, the singers have up to two quarter note beats to stop singing, even if in the middle of a phrase.

Instructions vary slightly for later appearances of this notation, as indicated in the score.

Note 3: Diamond shaped note heads, from bar 14: These indicate that the text is to be spoken to the given rhythm. The relative pitch of the voice is indicated but, in general, this is normal speech inflection.

Note 4: Long held notes, from bar 15: It is important that these sound as if in one breath. This can be achieved by 'staggering' the breathing, if necessary, (i.e. the singers take their breath at different times).
