ABOUT THE SCORE

- 1. Accidentals apply only to the notes they precede, except in the case of occasional repeated chords, e.g. at page 3, line 2 etc.
- 2. A large flat or sharp before a chord or cluster means that all the notes in it are flat or sharp respectively.
 - 3. Tmeans as short as possible.
 - 4. means as short and as fast as possible.
- 5. At page 5, line 2 etc. and at page 9, line 3 etc. the bar length remains constant (i.e. 2 seconds) and the groups of attacks are placed within the bar according to their position on the page.
- 6. In the large cluster group at page 9, line 4, bars 2 and 3 the horizontal strokes at the end of the stem indicate the approximate register of the outer extremities of the clusters which are to be played as dense as possible, with the palm.
- 7. At page 5, line 3 etc. it is recommended that the cluster be held down with a heavy strip of wood or metal (ideally lead piping) of about 11½ inches in length. On some instruments, even the lead piping will be too light, in which case the aid of an assistant will be required.
- 8. Special Choir piston to be prepared as follows:—Gamba (8'), Gemshorn (4'), 2\frac{3}{8}', 2', 1\frac{3}{6}', 1\frac{1}{8}'.
- 9. Some latitude in registration is left to the player, although conventional 8", 4', 2' doublings should be avoided. Textures should tend to be bright and harsh or veiled and mysterious.

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
