

Byzantine Mosaics

for Solo Flute

1. Arabesque

In which the flute explores the curving shapes of Oriental decoration.

2. Icon

A representation of a saint or even of God; the image often having a sacred as well as symbolic significance to the worshiper.

3. Iconoclast

At times of religious reformation, Icons were often seen as idolatrous, and were destroyed, "broken". The tune from the previous movement is shattered.

4. Pantokrator

The forbidding image of God the Father and Creator of All, which appears in the highest dome of many Byzantine churches.

The pieces are written without time signatures, and should be performed flexibly.

Byzantine Mosaics won the Society for Modern Music's Prize in 1969. it was first performed by the Society in Holborn Library. The work was later broadcast by David Haslam in the 1976 BBC Young Composers' Forum.
