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During 1992, Martin Read was commissioned to write music for a Channel 4 'Dispatches' programme on the pollution of this country's ground water. Water Music links the different musical ideas, from the programme, into a coherent whole; expressing his concern about the dire state of our national 'liquid asset'. The cor anglais and the use of parallel fifths is used to create an English pastoral feel, whilst the final slow dance is based on the plainsong Ad Organum Faciendum, which, together with the earlier use of polyphony, depicts the country's centuries old choral tradition - a mere babe compared to the land we pollute. The work can also be seen as an exercise in metric modulation; varying the tempo of different sections, whilst maintaining a constant pulse throughout.

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
