CURTAIN OF LIGHT was first performed by Elizabeth Davis at the Almeida Theatre, Islington, London on June 26th 1984.

Duration: 10'30"

Instrumentation:- 1 bell-tree or "whisper chime" (as constructed by Michael Ranta of Asian Sound, Koln). As high in pitch and as microtonal in tuning as possible.

6 high bells, probably Indian or Chinese.

8 gongs of as indeterminate pitch as possible but matching in tone quality. All higher than the tam-tams in pitch, but all lower than the bells.

3 tam-tams: medium, large and very large.

Presentation:- The lighting of the stage is very important. The changes of lighting are notated in the score but the full lighing should be as powerful, drenching as possible. The player should wear simple clothes, e.g. all white. The instruments should be fixed either: 1) on a frame which partially surrounds the player or 2) on a bar/or bars which descend slowly from the flies before the piece begins.

Tape part:- The stereo tape is designed to be played off Ch 1 and Ch 2 of a TEAC A3440 machine, while on Ch 4 there is a pulse to give clock-timings on an Electrosonics M2X clock. Alternatively a stop-watch can be used with a purely 2-track stereo version of the tape.
