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Winter Variations is a journey from winter to spring - from minor to major. At times grandiose, at times capricious, it is not a direct journey but a tortuous one, through treacherous winds and icy sun, through winter's beauty and spring's calm.

This dramatic and virtuosic work plays for about 13 minutes in a continuous movement, and was commissioned for Jamie Walton and Daniel Grimwood by the Tunbridge Wells International Young Artists Competition in conjunction with Concerts Originaux des Amis. They gave it its first performance in Tunbridge Wells on 3rd April 1998, in a concert funded by the National Lottery and the Arts Council of Great Britain.

Alan Bullard's compositions are widely performed and broadcast, and appear on several CDs. Born in 1947, he is currently Head of Composition at the Colchester Institute School of Music.

Other works by Alan Bullard for cello include Reflections for cello and piano (Colne Edition) The Arctic Needle for solo cello (unpublished), and, for beginner cellists, Party Time! and Lunar Landscapes, both for cello and piano and published by ABRSM (Publishing). His Trio for violin, cello, and piano, the string quartet Prelude and Metamorphosis, and a number of works for string orchestra are available from Colne Edition.
