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## **Sonata for Solo Cello**

*Commissioned by Steven Isserlis with funds provided by the John S.Cohen Foundation.*

This work is based on a theme by Sir William Walton (1902-1983) dating from 1970. On the original manuscript, Walton wrote: ‘Tema per variazioni’ but, as far as we know, he never added any variations. When Steven Isserlis asked me to write variations on this theme, I decided to compose a piece which is a voyage of discovery in search of Walton’s melody. The music is in four continuous movements: Praeludium, Passacaglia, Dance and Song. The first three are based on various aspects of the original which, having been gradually revealed, is heard as the ‘Song’ at the close.

The work is dedicated to the memory of Steven Isserlis’ mother, Cynthia Isserlis, who died whilst I was working on the score.
