Text: (from Seven Signs of the Plague - cca: fifteenth century)

The first is when on a summer's day the weather often changes,  
as in the morning when the weather appears to rain, then it appears  
cloudy and at the last, windy in the south.  
The second token is when in summer the day appears all dark and like to rain and  
yet it rains not,  
and if many days so continue it is to dread of great pestilence.  
The third token is when a great multitude of flies is upon the earth,  
then it is a sign that the air is venomous and infected.  
The fourth token is when the stars seem often to fall,  
then it is taken that the air is infected with much venomous vapours.  
The fifth token is when a blazing star is seen in the element,  
then it is a sign that soon after there will be great pestilence or great  
slaughter in battle.  
The sixth token is when there is great lightning and thunder,  
namely out of the south.  
The seventh token is when great winds pass out of the south,  
they being foul and unclean.  
Therefore, when these tokens appear it is to dread of great pestilence, but God in  
his great mercy will remove it.
