INTRODUCTORY NOTE

ON 17 November 1910, Frank Bridge conducted the first performance of his five Entr'actes for the production of the play *The Two Hunchbacks* by the Belgian writer Emile Cammaerts. The play was the second part of a double-bill which began with a staging of Handel's oratorio *L'Allegro ed il Penseroso*, and was part of an opera season produced at the Savoy Theatre in London by Cammaerts' daughter, the mezzo-soprano Maria Brema (the first Angel in Elgar's *Dream of Gerontius*). Cammaerts' fairy-tale play, set in the Belgian Ardennes, was given in an English version by his wife Tita Brand.

Although Bridge had come to public notice as a player and composer of chamber music, much of his living was earned playing viola and violin in London's orchestras. From time to time he was engaged as conductor as well, mainly with the New Symphony Orchestra and deputising for Henry Wood with the Queen's Hall Orchestra. During 1910 and 1911 he composed what have become his most popular orchestral works, *Suite for Strings* and the orchestral suite *The Sea*. There were also three occasional pieces: incidental music for military band for George V's Coronation celebrations 'The Pageant of London'; a coronation March submitted, unsuccessfully, for a Worshipful Company of Musicians competition; and the five Entr'actes.

These five characteristic movements reveal Bridge as a master of the genre of light theatre music. He based them on appropriate folk tunes, supplied by the author, and used a standard theatre orchestra of the time, including double woodwind, a pair of trumpets and horns, but with three trombones and a harp. This instrumentation gave him additional tonal resources and no doubt helped make his modest orchestra sound more ample and colourful.

In order to provide a satisfactory shape for the work in concert performance, I have re-ordered the movements as follows:

1. Prelude to Act 1 *Allegretto moderato*—a gentle introduction
2. Change of scene, Act 2 *Andantino*—a simple hymn-like arrangement
3. Change of scene, Act 3 *Allegretto (marziale)*—a bright fade-in/fade-out quick march
4. Entr'acte between Acts 2 and 3 *Lento*—a romance beginning with a haunting cor anglais solo
5. Entr'acte between Acts 1 and 2 *Moderato*—a robust finale
