## for orchestra

Early in 1964 I received a request from Mauricio Kagel for a chamber orchestral work for a concert in Brussels. Thereupon I wrote Bun No. 2 (temporarily abandoning Bun No. 1) and it was played at Brussels Radio on December 12th 1964. With the exception of the passages marked FALSCH (2) and FALSCH (3) the piece is based on pp 45 - 51 (middle) of Treatise. In a way it represents an analysis of that passage of Treatise.



- \*\* Trombones need straight mutes and cup mutes, and a metal 'hat' attached to a stand ( •= bell in hat: ·o = normal; •= o = move bell gradually out from behind hat).

A  $\cap$   $\cap$  are medium, long and very long pauses or holds.

All instruments sound as written except Piccolo (written an octave lower), Double Bassoon and Double Basses (written an octave higher).

If possible, the piece should be played twice (not consecutively) in the same programme. The first performance should contain only the parts head RICHTIG (bars 10-46, 64-77, 92-124), and the notes written in square brackets in bars 46, 64 and 92 should be omitted. The second performance should omit nothing.
