
DIRECTIONS FOR PERFORMANCE

The sustaining pedal may be used at the performer's discretion, to assist phrasing. The marking Ped._____ must, however, be strictly observed as meaning depress, hold for the duration of the horizontal line (regardless of phrasing), and release; the depression and release should be 'obvious' to the audience (unlike legato pedalling, which should not!), the release usually coinciding with the sffz attacks in the bass (except at the very end of the piece). These punctuations, which are the only attacks touder than pp in the entire piece, must not the general flow of the music, which should be very relaxed and essentially 'monochromatic' throughout. To this end it is also important that the relationship between J = 56 and J = 42 is borne in mind - in particular ρ at J = 56 is the same as the fact that at

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
